

For the past three years, I have been working as principal of the Lejanías Adventist School. Initially I was hired as school coordinator, and in 2020, I was promoted to principal, not knowing that soon I would have to face the difficulties of a pandemic. Nevertheless, with God's help, we were able to move forward. We are working on expanding the building. I was born and raised in Cape Verde; a country made up of 10 small islands off the coast of West Africa. I got married and had my first child in my last year of high school, and I could not graduate. However, the dream of completing high school and taking my education to the high-

est level possible never diminished. Consequently, a few years after marriage, I completed my high school program and subsequently gained a college degree.

After finishing my undergraduate program, I started a business in my field of training (psychology), the goal of which was to help families develop skills that empower them to successfully navigate life and embrace the opportunities it provides. Hopefully, this would be reflected in the community and society at large.

As time transpired, my husband and I decided to build our own house and position ourselves to help our two daughters prepare for college. In the process, I supported my husband in his pursual of a Master's degree, putting my own academic ambitions on hold in the process.

With this new plan, my intention is to resume my business starting with the health/physical-care area, progressively incorporating the mental-health and spiritual aspects.

I am passionate about serving my community and adding value to the lives of people wherever I find myself. My personal and professional aspiration after finishing my religion and nursing programs is to help others who like me struggle either physically, mentally, or spiritually. In my community, as far as I know, I am the second female majoring in religion and will be the first to work actively in this field. I believe that my community needs me, and God is calling me to give my contribution in such a time as this.

I was in my last year of high school, and like most of my peers, I didn't know my calling. In the beginning, I had medicine on my mind, so I was processing all the paperwork to go to River Plate Adventist University (UAP), in Argentina; nevertheless, that project

started becoming blurred. I started asking myself if that was what I really wanted, or if I was being pressed to go that route.

A few months later, I became aware that my inclinations for the medical field was just pressure, and it was clear to me, I did not want to do that for the rest of my life.
