Thank you for your support for Yvonne Gameti and for the donations you sent to TEAM to assist with her return flight from the Philippines to Togo! She finally arrived home in Togo on December 19, 2020. Gameti graduated with a Master

of Divinity degree from the Adventist International Institute of Advanced Studies (AIIAS) in May 2020 but had to remain there until the COVID lockdown ended in December 2020.

AIIAS President Ginger Ketting-Weller was so impressed with her (she had attended Dr. Weller's Sabbath school class) that she arranged with colleagues at Andrews University for her to have a graduate assistant position at the seminary. Gameti will be starting a doctoral program at Andrews in August 2021. We may have a new female theologian from Togo in the Adventist Church!

COMPUTERS FOR ONLINE LEARNING STILL NEEDED!



Mercy Hiuko is an evangelist, wife, mother of two, and a student at Bugema University in Kampala, Uganda. A TEAM tuition and laptop scholarship recipient, she hopes to graduate in the spring of 2022. Hiuko is grateful for

TEAM support and says that seeing how TEAM has supported her call to ministry has been a witness to many members of her family.

In 2020, TEAM received a \$12,500 donation from the trust of Sonja A. Nicola for the purchase of laptop computers. In addition, other donors have contributed \$400 or more to purchase laptops. To date, we have spent \$16,315 on 48 laptops for TEAM scholarship recipients whose only access to their school programs is through online study. Included in the funding was the purchase of 16 laptops for all the female students at the Cuba Adventist Theological Seminary, as well as recipients in Africa, Inter-America, and South America. TEAM will be funding laptops for at least the next year for women who are continued on next page
